

LTC Michael M. Goglia was born on Long Island, NY, grew up in Nashua, NH, and graduated from Norwich University with an ROTC commission in 2007 as a 2LT in Air Defense Artillery.

His assignments include Platoon Leader in D/5-52 AMD at Fort Bliss, TX and one year deployed to the Kingdom of Bahrain. After completing his assignment at Fort Bliss as 11th ADA Brigade Assistant S3, he was assigned to 1-1 ADA in Okinawa, Japan. While in Okinawa, he served as the BN FDC OIC, Assistant S3, and Bravo Battery Commander. After Japan, LTC Goglia moved to Camp Hovey in the Republic of Korea in 2014 where he served as ADAM Cell OIC for 1st ABCT/2nd Infantry Division. He then served as the FMS Manager for USMTM in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.
