Brigade's History

The 30th Air Defense Artillery Brigade has roots dating from World War 1, specifically with the formation of the First Expeditionary Brigade, Coast Artillery Corps, Regular Army, at Fort Adams, Rhode Island, July 24, 1917.

Originally, it was known as the First Separate Brigade, Coast Artillery Corps, receiving its numerical designation as the 30th Artillery Brigade (Coast Artillery Corps-Railway), March 25, 1918. In that year the brigade took its heavy railway guns to France where it earned campaign streamers for the Saint-Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne offensives.

After the war the brigade returned from Europe and was inactivated at Camp Eustis, Virginia, in August 1921. Save for a four-year period 1926-1930, the 30th Artillery Brigade did not reappear on rolls of the active Army until 1960.

In 1949 the Army activated on Okinawa the 97th Anti-Aircraft Artillery Group composed of elements of the 61st and the 65th Artilleries. Armed with 78mm Skysweepers, 120mm and 90mm guns, the units of the 97th AAA served through a trouble-ridden decade that saw the Korean War, the Indo-China War and successive crises.

In 1959 the Army's 97th Group converted to the highly capable Nike-Hercules air defense missiles and on June 24, 1960, was redesignated the 30th Artillery Brigade (Air Defense).

As then constituted, the brigade was formed in part from the former subordinate units of the inactivated 97th, to include the brigade headquarters, the 2nd Missile Battalion, 61st Artillery and the 1st Missile Battalion, 65th Artillery.

In 1961 the 30th Brigade was brought to four-battalion strength with the arrival of battalions of the 1st and 3rd Artilleries armed with the deadly Hawk air defense missile to provide protection against low altitude aircraft. On June 6, 1961, the 30th Artillery Brigade (AD) became the first Allied unit to fire a Nike-Hercules missile outside CONUS.

The year 1968 saw the 44th Ordinance Company (Guided Missile) (General Support) (Direct Support) formed from four direct support platoons and two engineer detachments attached to the missile battalions.

The 30th Artillery Brigade (AD) emerged as a mission-oriented Army team of more than one arm or branch, for it included its own supporting Engineer, Ordinance and Signal elements. In turn, the air defense elements of the brigade, working under the



operational control of the 313th Air Division, worked closely with the U.S. Air Force as part of a highly effective multi-service air defense team, protecting Okinawa from possible hostile air attack.

In October of 1969 the brigade was reorganized with the four battalions being reduced in strength and combined into two- one Hawk (8th Battalion, 1st Artillery) and one Nike-Hercules (8th Battalion, 3rd Artillery). The battalions of the 61st and the 65th Artillery were returned to inactive status.

On September 14, 1971, both the 1st and 3rd Artilleries were redesignated as Air Defense Artillery, as a result of the realignment of the Army Artillery Regiments, and on 13 March 1972, the brigade was redesignated from the 30th Artillery Brigade (Air Defense) to the 30th Air Defense Artillery Brigade.

On November 21, 1969, in a joint communiqué, U.S. President Richard M. Nixon and Japanese Prime Minister Eisaku Sato announced that the Government of Japan and the Government of the United States of America should enter immediately into negotiations for the reversion of the Ryukyu Islands to Japan. After extensive planning, the reversion of the Ryukyu Islands took place on March 15, 1972, terminating over 25 years of United States administration.

Included in the reversion agreements was an arrangement that Japan would assume the responsibility for the air, ground and maritime defense of the Islands not later than July 1, 1973. The Government of Japan agreed to deploy A Nike group (3 batteries), a Hawk group (4batteries) and appropriate supporting troops to Okinawa to carry on the surface-to-air missile role in the Air Defense Mission. Additionally, the Government of Japan agreed to buy the U.S. equipment presently located on site.

A Surface-to-Air Missile Transfer Plan was jointly prepared by U.S. Army, Japan Air Self Defense Force (JASDF) and Japan Ground Self Defense Force (JGSDF) planners. The Nike missile systems were transferred to the JASDF and the Hawk missile system to JGSDF.

In accordance with the Transfer Plan, on-site orientation and familiarization took place on Nike sites, with 30th ADA Brigade and JASDF advance party personnel working and living together on site. Brigade personnel manned the sites until transfer was complete.

The 30th ADA Brigade was officially deactivated on June 12, 1973, in Oakland, California. On 18 May 2012, 6th ADA Brigade was redesignated to 30th Air Defense Artillery Brigade, transferred to TRADOC (now T2COM) and activated at Fort Sill, Oklahoma.

General Information to PCS

Prior to Arrival at Fort Sill:

1. Member Elections: Must be complete prior to receiving your orders to ensure your family is on your orders. Visit <https://ipps-a.army.mil/> to complete your member elections.
2. Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP): For Service Members with EFMP family members, there may be an EFMP requirement prior to receiving your orders.
3. Sponsorship: A sponsor is assigned by a newcomer's gaining unit and helps the newcomer before, during and after a move. If you haven't been assigned a sponsor, you can request one through your new unit. Units try to match sponsors and service members by rank and family status. Please visit <https://actnow.army.mil/> to complete your sponsorship forms and request.

4. IDs & Passports: **Ensure your CAC will not expire prior to your arrival.** If you are moving from OCONUS to CONUS, ensure your passports will not expire prior to your travel. Some countries require that your passport have at least *six months* of validity beyond the dates of your trip. Some airlines will not allow you to board if this requirement is not met.

5. Lodging Reservation: Book in advance to secure your space. Fort Sill Lodging is managed by IHG Army Hotels. Reservations can be made at 877-711-TEAM or www.ihg.com with Fort Sill as the location. Soldiers must present a copy of their travel orders and a military ID at check-in; pets are allowed in the hotel with ordinary restrictions.

Temporary Lodging Expenses is an allowance intended to partially pay members for lodging/meal expenses incurred by a member/dependent(s) while occupying temporary lodging during a PCS move. To see you qualify, please visit <https://www.dfas.mil/MilitaryMembers/travelpay/armypcs/tle/>. On post privatized lodging is not usually required, and local hotels offer competitive features and military discounts.



6. Housing:

On Post Housing: Visit the Corvias Property Management Website at <https://sill.corviaspm.com/> for information about availability and join the waitlist.

Off-Post Housing: For good references for off-post housing, visit <https://www.homes.mil/> to find local rental listings, photos, useful documents and more. The homes on this list have been inspected and are approved rental properties. **Check with on-post housing office prior to signing a lease to determine if housing is off limits.**

7. School Registration/CYSS – see *Schools in the Area*.

8. Household Goods (HHG) - If you are moving from OCONUS to CONUS you can split your HHGs into two shipments, unaccompanied baggage and HHG. Unaccompanied baggage can be used for essentials that are needed immediately.

After Your Arrival:

1. Report to the Fort Sill Welcome Center (BLDG 4700). **Ensure you bring a copy of your PCS Orders and IPPS-A Absence Request.**

- **Students:** Report IAW your course's welcome letter and ATRRS reporting instructions.

2. Register Privately Owned Weapons (POWs):

Soldiers reporting to Fort Sill due to a permanent change of station (PCS), MUST register privately owned weapons. Please visit <https://sill-www.army.mil/usag/des/weapons-registration.html> to complete the registration process.

3. Fort Sill Gates: There are six gates at Fort Sill. Under DoD guidelines, adults and certain children (children who are 16 years old or older and are driving a vehicle) without a current active-duty military I.D. card, family I.D. or retiree I.D. must go through the Visitors Welcome Center for a pass that will allow them unescorted access to Fort Sill. **To receive a visitors pass, you must have a REAL ID.** When the VWC is closed, passes to gain entry to Fort Sill can be obtained at Key West and Bentley Gate (Sheridan).

4. Fort Sill Lending Closet:

While waiting for your household goods to arrive, basic household items are available for loan (No Cost) for up to 30 days!

Traveling with Pets

A Service member may be authorized allowances associated with the costs of moving with one household pet (cat or dog). For moves within CONUS, the Service member may be reimbursed up to \$550 and for OCONUS, up to \$2,000.

As of 1 January 2024, if you have received PCS orders and have incurred expenses related to those orders, then you may be eligible to receive reimbursement.

Tips for Traveling with Pets (OCONUS):

- Vaccines must be up to date through arrival date
- Verify/update microchip
- Refill any prescriptions your pet may need
- Must have a letter from vet prior to flight (less than 10 days from flight)
- Kennel Requirements: (*subject to change*)
 - o Must be marked with your pet's name, destination or unit address and phone number (if available). Must have one green "Live Animals" and at least two "This Way Up" labels on opposite sides of the kennel.
 - o Ventilation must be provided on all 4 sides. One end must be fully ventilated (can be the door). Ventilation openings must be a maximum of 1"x1" for dogs and ¾"x¾" for cats.
 - o All openings must be nose and paw-proof.
 - o Your pet must be able to stand up, turn around and lay down in normal position.
 - o 2-piece kennels must be bolted together with metal nuts/bolts (*not plastic/nylon slides, clips or screws*).
 - o Provide separate food and water supply sources attached to the inside of the kennel. Water must be capable of replenishing without opening the kennel door.
- If traveling via Patriot Express, pet spaces are limited and booked on a first-come, first-served basis, and should be requested as early as possible.
- Pets may be denied travel due to extreme heat or cold weather.

Tips for Traveling with Pets (CONUS):

- On-Post Housing at Fort Sill requires a \$200 refundable pet deposit per pet and has a two-pet limit per household. Exotic animals such as monkeys, snakes, etc. are not permitted.
 - o Dogs belonging to restricted breeds to include full or mixed breed Pit Bull, American Staffordshire Bull Terrier or English Staffordshire Bull Terrier, Rottweiler, Presa Canario, Doberman Pinscher, Chow Chow, and wolf hybrids are prohibited from Fort Sill family housing areas.

Driving Under the Influence:

Oklahoma Senate Bill 54 – Aggravated DUI Law (effective 1 November 2025)

- First time DUIs involving one of the below aggravating factors are considered **aggravated DUIs** and can lead to **felony** prosecutions:
 - Causing a vehicle accident (even minor).
 - Eluding law enforcement or refusing to stop.
 - Speeding 20+ mph over the speed limit, or 10+ mph in a school zone.
 - Driving under the influence with a child passenger.
- SB54 mandates **minimum, non-suspendable jail time** for **aggravated** offenses:
 - First aggravated DUI: 10 days non-waivable.
 - Second aggravated DUI: 30 days non-waivable.
 - Subsequent offenses: additional mandatory jail time.
- Punishment for **first offense** as a **misdemeanor** are as follows:
 - Be punished by imprisonment in jail for no less than ten (10) days nor more than one (1) year.
 - Be fined no more than \$1,000.00.

There is no longer a requirement to administer a test of bodily fluid or breath within 2 hours of arrest to be admissible for prosecution.

Marijuana Laws:

Cannabis in Oklahoma is illegal for recreational use, but legal for medical use with a state-issued license.

Federal law supersedes the legislative initiatives of any state, district, or territory of the United States. This means that even though an active-duty service member might be living in a state where recreational use is tolerated, the **service member is still not allowed to possess, use, or distribute marijuana** in Oklahoma or anywhere else.

Marijuana **use or possession on base**, including privatized housing, is **prohibited**. This applies to spouses and dependents, as well as military members. Military installations are considered federal property, and they are governed by federal law.

Hunting & Fishing on Fort Sill:

State licensing must be purchased for **any** hunting or fishing activity.

Starting January 2024, all users must be validated before obtaining a permit (valid for 2 years).

To complete the user validation, all users must:

- Present DEERS ID card to Sportsman Services IN PERSON, verifying eligibility:
 - Dependents aged 10 years and older must have an ID card for Active-Duty families.
 - Child Dependents aged 21-23 enrolled as a full-time college student must present their college schedule as proof of benefit retention.
 - NAF/DAC dependents must present marriage license (spouse) or birth certificate (children) with ID cards.
- Present VA verification – VA letter showing 100% rating.
 - The 100% VA and Retired users will only need to do this user verification once – all other users will repeat this process upon expiration of DEERS ID cards. Failure to validate eligibility status will result in the user not being able to purchase annual Fort Sill permits or enter any lottery draws.
