Brigade's History

The 30th Air Defense Artillery Brigade has roots dating from World War 1, specifically with the formation of the First Expeditionary Brigade, Coast Artillery Corps, Regular Army, at Fort Adams, Rhod Island, July 24, 1917.

Originally, it was known as the First Separate Brigade, Coast Artillery Corps, receiving its numerical designation as the 30th Artillery Brigade (Coast Artillery Corps-Railway), March 25, 1918. In that year the brigade took its heavy railway guns to France where it earned campaign streamers for the Saint-Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne offensives.

After the war the brigade returned from Europe and was inactivated at Camp Eustis, Virginia, in August 1921. Save for a four-year period 1926-1930, the 30th Artillery Brigade did not reappear on rolls of the active Army until 1960.

In 1949 the Army activated on Okinawa the 97th Anti-Aircraft Artillery Group composed of elements of the 61st and the 65th Artilleries. Armed with 78mm Skysweepers, 120mm and 90mm guns, the units of the 97th AAA served through a trouble-ridden decade that saw the Korean War, the Indo-China War and successive crises.

In 1959 the Army's 97th Group converted to the highly capable Nike-Hercules air defense missiles and on June 24, 1960, was redesignated the 30th Artillery Brigade (Air Defense).

As then constituted, the brigade was formed in part from the former subordinate units of the inactivated 97th, to include the brigade headquarters, the 2nd Missile Battalion, 61st Artillery and the 1st Missile Battalion, 65th Artillery.

In 1961 the 30th Brigade was brought to four-battalion strength with the arrival of battalions of the 1st and 3rd Artilleries armed with the deadly Hawk air defense missile to provide protection against low altitude aircraft. On June 6, 1961, the 30th Artillery Brigade (AD) became the first Allied unit to fire a Nike-Hercules missile outside CONUS.

The year 1968 saw the 44th Ordinance Company (Guided Missile) (General Support) (Direct Support) formed from four direct support platoons and two engineer detachments attached to the missile battalions.

The 30th Artillery Brigade (AD) emerged as a mission-oriented Army team of more than one arm or branch, for it included its own supporting Engineer, Ordinance and Signal elements. In turn, the air defense elements of the brigade, working under the



operational control of the 313th Air Division, worked closely with the U.S. Air Force as part of a highly effective multi-service air defense team, protecting Okinawa from possible hostile air attack.

In October of 1969 the brigade was reorganized with the four battalions being reduced in strength and combined into two- one Hawk (8th Battalion, 1st Artillery) and one Nike-Hercules (8th Battalion, 3rd Artillery). The battalions of the 61st and the 65th Artillery were returned to inactive status.

On September 14, 1971, both the 1st and 3rd Artilleries were redesignated as Air Defense Artillery, as a result of the realignment of the Army Artillery Regiments, and on 13 March 1972, the brigade was redesignated from the 30th Artillery Brigade (Air Defense) to the 30th Air Defense Artillery Brigade.

On November 21, 1969, in a joint communiqué, U.S. President Richard M. Nixon and Japanese Prime Minister Eisaku Sato announced that the Government of Japan and the Government of the United States of America should enter immediately into negotiations for the reversion of the Ryukyu Islands to Japan. After extensive planning, the reversion of the Ryukyu Islands took place on March 15, 1972, terminating over 25 years of United States administration.

Included in the reversion agreements was an arrangement that Japan would assume the responsibility for the air, ground and maritime defense of the Islands not later than July 1, 1973. The Government of Japan agreed to deploy A Nike group (3 batteries), a Hawk group (4batteries) and appropriate supporting troops to Okinawa to carry on the surface-to-air missile role in the Air Defense Mission. Additionally, the Government of Japan agreed to buy the U.S. equipment presently located on site.

A Surface-to-Air Missile Transfer Plan was jointly prepared by U.S. Army, Japan Air Self Defense Force (JASDF) and Japan Ground Self Defense Force (JGSDF) planners. The Nike missile systems were transferred to the JASDF and the Hawk missile system to the JGSDF.

In accordance with the Transfer Plan, on-site orientation and familiarization took place on Nike sites, with 30th ADA Brigade and JASDF advance party personnel working and living together on site. Brigade personnel manned the sites until transfer was complete.

The 30th ADA Brigade was officially deactivated on June 12, 1973, in Oakland, California. On 18 May 2012, 6th ADA Brigade was redesignated to 30th Air Defense Artillery Brigade, transferred to TRADOC and activated at Fort Sill, Oklahoma.

General Information to PCS

Things to Get Started on Right Away

1. Member Elections: Must be complete prior to receiving your orders to ensure your family is on your orders. Visit <https://ipps-a.army.mil/> in order to complete your member elections.

2. EFMP: For Service Members who have EFMP family members, there may be an EFMP requirement prior to receiving your orders.

3. Sponsorship: A sponsor is assigned by a newcomer's gaining unit and helps the newcomer before, during and after a move. If you haven't been assigned a sponsor, you can request one through your new unit. Units try to match sponsors and service members by rank and family status. Please visit <https://actnow.army.mil/> to complete your sponsorship forms and request.

4. Passports and Visas: If moving from OCONUS to CONUS, ensure your passports will not expire prior to your travel.

5. Lodging Reservation: Lodging on Fort Sill can book up fast during peak PCS season. Book far enough in advance to secure your space. Temporary Lodging Expenses is an allowance intended to partially pay members for lodging/meal expenses incurred by a member/dependent(s) while occupying temporary lodging during a PCS move. Fort Sill Lodging is managed by IHG Army Hotels, a privatized contract service provider. IHG offers a standard slate of hotel services. Reservations can be made at 877-711-TEAM or ihg.com with Fort Sill location. Soldiers must present a copy of their travel orders and a military ID card; pets are allowed in the hotel with ordinary restrictions. On post privatized lodging is not usually required, and local hotels offer competitive features and military discounts. See below for details.

Traveling with Pets

As of 1 January 2024, military Service members going through a PCS within the continental United States can be reimbursed up to \$550 for on household pet, either cat or dog and up to \$2000 for moved from locations outside the continental United States to cover the costs related to the transportation of a pet. Service Member must ensure pet travel is listed on their orders prior to travel to be reimbursed.

Lending Closet:

While waiting for your household goods to arrive, basic household items are available for loan (No Cost) for up to 30 days!

Moving is a part of life for Soldiers and their Families. When transitioning to a new location, Army Community Service (ACS), Relocation Readiness Program has several resources to keep the total Army Family ready and resilient. One of those services is the ACS Lending Closet. The Lending Closet provides basic housekeeping items for temporary loan to incoming and outgoing Families. Items include:

- hospitality kits (dishes, pots/pans, silverware, glasses)
- coffee makers
- crock pots
- toasters
- irons/ironing boards
- mattress
- cots
- folding tables/chairs
- vacuum cleaners
- portable baby cribs
- highchairs

Fort Sill Gate: There are six gates at Fort Sill. In the past, adults could gain entry to Fort Sill by showing any government-issued I.D. card (driver's license, tribal membership, V.A. identification, etc.). After the attacks of 9/11, the Department of Defense (DoD) passed more restrictive rules for military bases worldwide, but the Army has been operating with an exemption to that rule until recently. The DoD guidelines require that everyone entering a military installation have a nationwide background check. With the lifting of the exemption, Fort Sill is implementing an installation access policy in accordance with Fort Sill Memo 190-13 that meets that background check requirement and will begin issuing photographic pass cards for all visitors and open a Visitors Control Center (VWC) (located just south of Bentley Gate on Sheridan Road) to manage the program. Under DoD guidelines, adults and certain children (children who are 16 years old or older and are driving a vehicle) without a current active-duty military I.D. card, family I.D. or retiree I.D. must go through the VWC for a pass card that will allow them unescorted access to Fort Sill. **To receive a pass card, you must have a REAL ID.** When the VWC is closed, passes to gain entry to Fort Sill can be obtained at Key West and Bentley Gate (Sheridan).

Sign in & In-Processing: To sign in from PCS leave, Permanent Party Soldiers should initially report to Building 1721, Fort Sill Blvd (located near the Commissary parking lot). The Fort Sill reception detachment cadre at Building 1721 will sign reporting personnel off leave. Once signed-in, Soldiers will receive follow-on instructions to proceed to Building 4700 to begin installation in-processing. The hours of operation for in-processing at Fort Sill are Monday through Friday from 0730-1600 and are closed on Saturdays and Sundays. To complete in-processing at Fort Sill, soldiers must bring an approved IPPS-A Leave Request, a copy of their permanent change of orders form, medical and personnel records. For more information call the Transient Reception Liaison NCO at 580-442-3217.

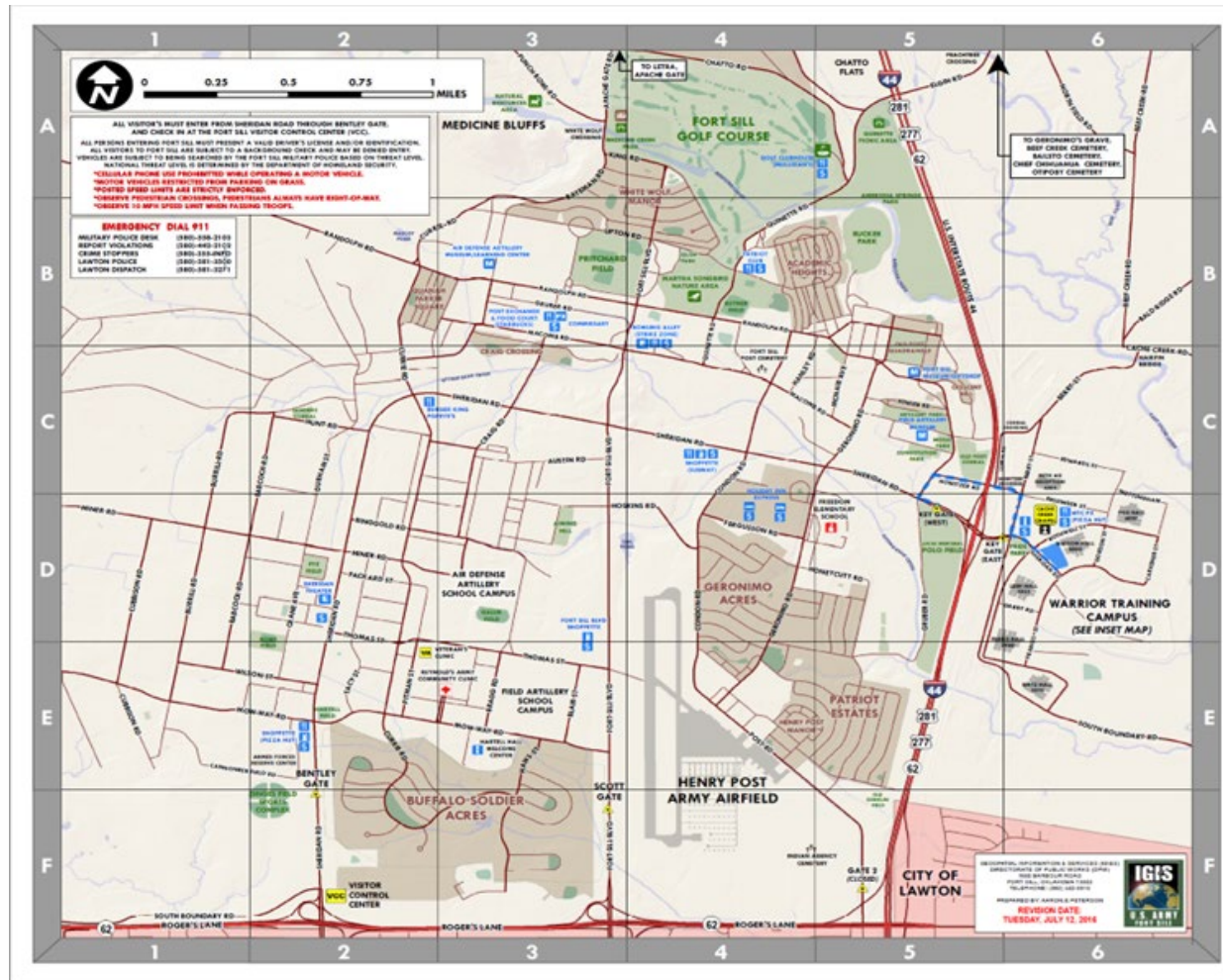

Top 10 Helpful Tips

- 1) Download MyArmyPost App
- 2) If you will be living in on post housing, put yourself on the waitlist immediately. You do not need orders to do so.
- 3) Consider purging your house for things you no longer need.
- 4) Prepare for your Move:
 - a. Create a PCS binder: Organization before a PCS is essential. A great way to keep track of important documents is to create a PCS binder. Use the binder to store everything from birth certificates to powers of attorney to packing checklists to calendar pages with important dates.
 - b. Ensure your CAC will not expire during travel.
 - c. Plan your PCS Travel days such as travel route and locations to stay.
 - d. Don't forget about your car's maintenance and documentation.
 - e. Proper pet documentations to cross border and for lodging.
 - f. Prescription medication is likely crucial to someone in your family, including pets. Inspect refills and prepare to leave with as much medicine as you are allowed.
 - g. Register for school/childcare.
- 5) Ensure you have contact with your sponsor throughout your PCS process.

 - c. Auto Insurance
 - d. Bills
 - e. Tricare
 - f. Amazon
- 9) File your travel voucher through Smart Voucher (This is also part of Fort Sill's in processing)
- 10) File any moving claims for lost/damaged items.
