ort Sill is a 'closed' post. In order to gain access you must show a valid Military Identification Card. Visitors without a military ID must complete a Fort Sill Form 118 and go to the Fort Sill Visitor Control Center to request access to Fort Sill.

When the VCC is closed, passes to gain entry to Fort Sill can be obtained at Key

West Gate and Bentley Gate Sheridan Road.

Who Needs a Pass?

- •All adults who do not have a DODapproved identification card.
- •All vehicle drivers who are 16 or 17 years of age.
- •Veterans who do not have a DODapproved identification card. The V.A.issued identification card no longer meets the criteria for installation access.

Installation access cards from other DOD installations for example: Tinker Air Force Base, Sheppard Air Force Base, Fort Hood do not meet the criteria for installation access. Fort Sill has a "stand alone" installation access process and does not share information with other DOD installations. here is a military representative at the Lawton Municipal Airport from 4:30 a.m. until the last flight arrives, usually about 10:30 p.m. Upon arrival at the airport, you may want to stop by the military desk and request a Fort Sill Guide booklet and a Map. The booklet contains information, a phone directory, and Fort Sill/Lawton maps. The map also contains information, the Lawton map on one side and Fort Sill map on the other side.

If you drive from the Lawton Municipal Airport to Fort Sill, once you leave the airport you will come to a stop sign at 11th Street. Turn left on 11th Street and remain on it; It will become Fort Sill Boulevard that will lead you directly to the installation through Scott Gate. The distance from the Lawton Municipal Airport to Fort Sill is about 5 miles. You and your dependents will need a military ID card to gain access on post. Security



personnel stationed at the gates should provide additional assistance and will direct you to the Lodging, Officer in Charge (OIC) after working hours, or the Welcome Center, depending on your orders, time of arrival, rank, and marital status. It is not recommend that you fly to Oklahoma City Will Rogers World Airport, unless you are planning to rent a car at the Will Rogers World Airport in Oklahoma City to drive to Fort Sill. There is no public transportation to Fort Sill from OK City, unless you use the Greyhound Bus, for which you will need to check their schedule and stops, and purchase the bus ticket.

Driving from Oklahoma City Will Rogers World Airport

If you drive from Oklahoma City Will Rogers World Airport, as you exit the terminal building, you will be on Meridian Road northbound. In approximately 1.5 miles, you will come to Airport Road. You should get on it eastbound. At the intersection of Interstate 44 (I-44), exit south on I-44, at which time you will be on Mile Marker 116. (Be ready to pay 2 tolls during your drive from OK City - will need \$2.75 to cover for both.) Remain on I-44 for the next 80 miles or so until you see the signs for "Key Gate", and exit on Key Gate, mile marker 41.

Ground Transportation



BUS/TAXI

The only cab service allowed to enter Fort Sill is AmeriCab Company. If you have no one to bring you to Fort Sill to process in, usually AmeriCab usually parked in front of the airport where you can easily flag one, or you may want to make use of the public phone to call AmeriCab 580-355-5555. The average cost for the taxi from the Lawton Municipal Airport to Fort Sill is \$10.00 for one person and \$2.00 for each additional person using the cab, prices are subject to change without prior notice.

Our fixed route system operates each hour, Monday-Friday, 6:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. * Ask the operator for a transfer to complete your one-way trip. Transfers are valid for 45 minutes from the time/ date stamp. Medicare cardholders, seniors (62 and older), and persons with disabilities can apply for their photo identification card at the LATS office located at 611 SW Bishop Road. Present your Medicare card for the medicare discount, proof of age for senior discount, or complete an application regarding disability for discount.*



LATS Fort Sill Shuttle

All who want to book a trip on the Fort Sill Shuttle need to call the LATS office at (580)248-5252. Ext 2. Each ride is \$1.50 and passengers will pay once on board the vehicle. Fort Sill shuttle hours are the same as the fixed route.

Passengers going to Fort Sill will use the Downtown Transfer Center and travel to their destination on Fort Sill. Passengers will need to call LATS to schedule this trip. Passengers may schedule a pickup to 2(two) hours before their pickup.

Passengers wanting to go from Fort Sill to Lawton will be picked up from their location on Fort Sill and dropped off at the Downtown Transfer Center Passengers may schedule a pickup 2 (two) hours before their pickup. If you need to transfer to the fixed route just ask the driver for a transfer ticket





Permanent Party Soldiers

Upon arrival, all permanently assigned Soldiers report to the Welcome Center (Hartell Hall) at building 4700 Mow-Way Road (Main East entrance under the awning). The Welcome Center reception desk is manned by military personnel and open 24 hours daily. The reception desk personnel then sign Soldiers in from leave, assist with billeting, and brief Soldiers when to return to in-process. Normal Hours of Operation for the In-Out Processing Section is 0730-1630 Monday through Friday, closed Saturdays, Sundays, and Federal holidays. **Points of contact during in-processing are as follow:** Branch Chief (580) 442-5159, Supervisor (580) 442-5122 and Team Leader (580) 442-6119. For driving instructions to this building click "HERE." Map The contact number for the Welcome Center reception desk is 580-442-3217, DSN 639.

Upon arrival at Building 4700, Soldiers must turn-in their DA Form 31 and Permanent Change of Station (PCS) orders.

A 4-day in-processing period is normal at Fort Sill. All new permanently assigned military personnel receive briefings on programs, assistance, and services available on the installation, with attendance at some briefings mandatory. Upon completion of the central inprocessing, Soldiers report to their gaining units.



Privately Owned Weapons (POW): Soldiers reporting to Fort Sill due to

a permanent change of station (PCS), MUST register any privately owned weapons with the Police Administrative Branch, building 1649. You must clear through the Police Administrative Branch and request cancellation of firearms registration as part of out-processing.

Required Documents: Upon arrival at Building 4700, Soldiers must turn-in the following items:


- DA Form 31
- Permanent Change of Station (PCS) Orders

Permissive TDY (House Hunting): Permissive TDY (house hunting) must be approved by the losing command prior to arrival at Fort Sill. For those with pre-approved permissive TDY, report to the Housing Services Office, Building 4700, 3rd Floor to have your DA Form 31 stamped with the date of arrival to begin your 10 day house hunting. Soldiers without pre-approved permissive TDY from their losing command must complete in-processing to their gaining unit at Fort Sill and then request permissive TDY through their new commander.

Installation In-processing: Installation in-processing is conducted Monday, Wednesday, and Friday for all permanent party Soldiers. SFC through CSM; CW2 through CW5; ILT and above complete in-processing the same day. The majority of processing is conducted in Building 4700 to include ID Cards, Finance, Housing, and ACS. New arrivals are briefed by several agencies on programs, assistance, and services available on the installation. Briefings/training includes the following:

housing office in person for counseling and guidance before entering into any agreement, written lease, or rental/sales contract for off-post housing.

Assistance offered by the local housing office can often save you money and possible later inconveniences should you be unaware of the regulations governing off-post housing. FORT SILL HOUSING SERVICES OFFICE ... FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. I have just arrived to Fort Sill. How do I locate information about available and affordable off-post rentals that are located in a suitable neighborhood?

A. First, visit the Fort Sill Housing Services Office located 4700 Mow Way Road, 3rd floor(Welcome Center) for assistance in finding a rental that meets your needs. You are required to do this before you sign any lease contracts or deposit any funds to secure a rental.

Q. I have located a prospective rental unit however I have questions regarding some basic health and safety items with the rental unit. Who do I contact for assistance?

A. You should contact the Housing Services Office before you sign a lease agreement. We have qualified staff to assist you with the necessary steps in conducting a walk through inspection.

Q. I am considering renting a house and the landlord has offered me a discount on my monthly rental fee if I agree to do any required repairs and upgrades to the house myself. Should I accept this arrangement?

A. If you accept this offer, you and the landlord should put everything you

agree in writing, i.e.,

what will be fixed and when. You and the landlord must both sign the paper. Keep a copy for your records.

Q. What is the purpose of a security deposit?

A. A security deposit is money you pay to your prospective landlord to secure the rental unit. It is generally refunded in full to you at the end of the lease agreement, assuming no damages above and beyond fair wear and tear. Ensure that the amount you pay as a "security deposit" is annotated in your lease. You should never plan to use your security deposit as payment for the last month rent. In most cases, the security deposit is returned to you within 30 days of the final termination inspection. The exception being, when there are assessed damages, and repairs must be made to the rental dwelling.

Q. I have a pet and the Landlord wants a pet deposit.

A. Essentially, pets pose additional liability to the Landlord. If you are a pet owner, you may be asked to pay a honrefundable" pet fee. If you own a pet that is considered an "aggressive breed" you should expect that it will be challenging to find a suitable rental unit due to the associated liability to the Landlord. Most local lease agreements will have a list of the breeds that they are unwilling to accept.

Q. What if provisions of the lease agreement differ from the law?

A. Any provision which conflicts with a mandatory part of the law is unenforceable.

Q. I have fulfilled my lease agreement and now I want to vacate. What actions must I take?

A. A written notice, at least 30 days, must be submitted to your landlord. Remember to always provide the Landlord with a forwarding address if you are anticipating a security deposit refund. Always retain a copy of all paperwork for your records.

Q. How do I terminate my lease agreement when I receive my military orders and invoke the Servicemembers Civil Relief Act (SCRA)?

A. To terminate the lease agreement, the Servicemember must deliver to the lessor/landlord written notice of



termination and a copy of official military orders or a notification, certification, or verification from the Servicemember's commanding officer with respect to the Servicemember's current or future military duty status. Verbal notice is not sufficient. Delivery of the written notice may be accomplished in a number of ways, including hand deliver, private business carrier, or by certified mail with return receipt requested. In all circumstances, the Servicemember should obtain some proof that the lessor/landlord received the written notice and the date upon which receipt occurred. Note: For questions or concerns related to residential leases please seek guidance from your Legal Assistance Office.

Q. I live off-post on the local economy. How do I file a complaint against my Landlord or Property Manager?

A. The first step is to contact the Landlord or Property Manager and try to resolve the issue. If your Landlord or Property Manager fails to resolve your issue in the allotted time as promised, you can visit with the Fort Sill Housing Services Office at 4700 Mow Way Road, 3RD floor (580) 442-5190. We will assist you in resolving/mediating the potential complaint.

Basic Housing Allowance (BAH)-OVERVIEW

BAH rates are based on local area rental market data and vary by geographic duty station, pay grade and dependency status. The cost of utilities and renters' insurance is also considered.

BAH is based only on rental properties, not homeownership costs like mortgage payments and property taxes. The goal is that members receive a BAH that is sufficient to live a reasonable distance from a duty station.

RATES

BAH also includes rate protection. This means, if a member's current BAH rate is less than the previous year, the member receives at least the same amount of BAH as the previous year, provided that the member's duty location, rank and dependency status stays the same. If BAH rates go up, the member will receive the higher BAH rate as long as eligibility is uninterrupted. This ensures that members who have made long-term commitments in the form of a lease or contract are not penalized if the area's housing costs decrease.

HOUSING

BAH enables Service members to live off-base comparably to their civilian counterparts. It is not designed to cover all housing costs for all members. Some members may have out-of-pocket expenses, because rates are based on the median cost of rent. A member's actual expenses may be higher or lower based on a member's actual choice of housing and where they live.

Because members are free to make housing choices what best suit their needs, a ember may choose to use all their housing allowance to rent for more expensive housing close to the duty station, or have a longer commute for either a larger or less expensive house in an outlying area.
