



Target Material Production (TMP) 2E-F242/250-F88

Instructs Target Coordinate Mensuration (TCM) and production of Target Materials for entry into the Modernized Integrated Database (MIDB) as part of Advanced Target Development in the Joint Targeting Cycle.

Target Mensuration Only (TMO) 2E-F276/250-F66

Trains and certifies personnel on Target Coordinate Mensuration (TCM) to support the employment of coordinate-seeking munitions during deliberate or dynamic targeting where the derived coordinate will not be entered into Modernized Integrated Database (MIDB).

Collateral Damage Estimation (CDE) 2E-F238/250-F86

The course covers the fundamentals of determining precise target location and mitigating collateral damage using Collateral Damage Estimation (CDE) through the application of approved Collateral Damage Estimate Methodology (CDM) in accordance with CJCSI 3160.01B, No-Strike and the Collateral Damage Estimation Methodology, for the employment of joint and organic munitions.

Precision Fires Weaponering Certification (WPN) 2E-F277/250-F67

Trains personnel assigned to fire support and targeting cells and targeting staffs to conduct Weaponering in order to determine a supporting munition solution that will achieve target effects. Includes hands-on experience solving surface-to-surface and air-to-surface Weaponering problems for a variety of targets using JTCG/ME certified JWS software.



Targeting Division

Army Targeting Committee:

Serves as the Secretariat to the Three -Star forum for the Army Targeting Enterprise to discuss Army and Joint-related targeting issues. Serves as a Co-Chair in the Intelligence & Target Production Subcommittee, the Targeting Modernization Subcommittee, and the Targeting Training & Personnel Subcommittee.

Army Force Modernization Proponent:

Serves as the designated representative for the Army's Force Modernization Proponent for Targeting on behalf of the Commanding General, Fires Center of Excellence.

Targeting Community of Interest (COI):

Host to a forum of targeting professionals where targeting initiatives and topics of community interest are discussed.

Targeting Automations and Modernization:

Collaborates with Army Capabilities Managers and Industry Partners to develop targeting requirements for emerging technology.

Military Targeting Committee:

Serves as the Army's only associate member at the Executive Steering Committee. Participates as a member of each of the four subcommittees. Serves as the conduit to bring Army Targeting topics to the Joint Staff.

Functional Courses:

Executes world-class program of instruction for five functional courses (CDE, JITD, TMO, TMP, Weaponering). Delivering instruction at Fort Sill (resident) and world-wide (MTT).

Joint Operational Fires and Effects (JOFEC) 2E-SIL8/250-ASIL8(MC)

Designed to bridge the targeting knowledge gap, educate leaders from all services, multi-national partners, and government agencies for senior service components and JTF staff positions in the skills to employ Joint Fires and the Joint Targeting Process to achieve lethal and non-lethal effects

- Students take on the roles of a JFC Staff during the course
- Produces ASI L8
- Foundry funded for MI Personnel
- 80 Hour Program of Instruction
- 12-16 Hour (1 ½ Days) Executive Session (O-6 and above) available by request *in conjunction with scheduled JOFEC MTT

Joint Intermediate Target Development (JITD) 2E-F241/250-F87

- Focused on teaching Intelligence Analysts the fundamentals of Basic and Intermediate Target Development to joint standards for entry into the Modernized Integrated Database (MIDB)
- Includes an introduction to Intelligence Community databases, research methods, and live environment training
- DIA Accredited
- 80 Hour (2 Wks) Program of Instruction
- Foundry funded for MI Personnel
- TS/SCI Clearance and prior read-on Required to attend.
