

Restoration Advisory Board

Public Notice

Fort Sill leadership would like to determine if there is enough community interest to support the establishment of a Restoration Advisory Board (RAB). The purpose of a RAB is to promote stakeholder involvement in the installation's Defense Environmental Restoration Program (DERP). The RAB will be established and operated in accordance with 32 CFR Part 202 and the Army's implementing guidance.

A RAB is an advisory board made up of community stakeholders who represent the diverse interests of the community as well as representatives of local, state, and federal agencies. Stakeholders may be those affected directly or indirectly by environmental restoration activities occurring at the installation (family members of military personnel, civilian workers, government officials, tribal community members, local landowners, etc.).

Participation in a RAB involves a time commitment from volunteers and provides a valuable platform for individuals interested in Fort Sill's environmental restoration activities to exchange information with state regulators, installation personnel, and other stakeholders. If there is sufficient interest, Fort Sill will consider establishing a RAB with members willing to commit to attending regular meetings for at least one year. These members will also provide feedback on ongoing restoration activities at Fort Sill.
