Safety Policy Statement Commanding Officer Marine Artillery Detachment

- -People are this unit's most valuable asset.
- -Your safety and that of our Marines and Families is critical to our Mission Success, as well as your personal and professional development.
- -The loss of any Marine, Sailor or Family member due to a preventable accident, on or off duty, is unacceptable and adverse to unit readiness and a positive command climate.
- -Our profession is inherently dangerous and we must mitigate the associated risks.
- -We will not be risk averse. When we do accept risk, we will have mitigated it as far as possible and do so from an informed, logical position.
- -I expect each one of us to know our limits; including those of our fellow Marines and Family members. None of us are invincible!
- -When it comes to safety, verify everything.
- <u>-Time management.</u> When we rush, we are more accident prone.
- -Take care of yourself. Rest will take you further than adrenaline.
- -When we see an unsafe act, we are required to intervene.
- <u>-Range mentality</u>. We are all Safety Officers and expected to call "check-fire" if we see something unsafe; on or off duty.
- -Have a plan. Ensure you aren't the only one who knows it.
- -Treat Safety Briefs like Patrol Briefs. Know what to do if a mishap does occur.
- -Leaders will incorporate risk management, IAW applicable Orders and Directives, during all unit planning and confirmation briefs.
- -If a safety mishap occurs, <u>report it immediately</u>. We will ensure the proper <u>treatment</u> of injured personnel, and we will <u>learn</u> to avoid similar mishaps in the future.
